We will ensure a close cooperation of development partners and the government of Bangladesh in implementing the PPTA. As suggested by Germany, during PPTA implementation, we will give greater attention to identifying opportunities for women in climate resilient rural infrastructure planning and design. The opportunities and engagement of women in climate resilient rural infrastructure will be incorporated in the gender action plan. The PPTA will have a Knowledge Management Specialist to conduct a need assessment of knowledge management activities. This specialist will review and assess current system of information and data analysis and management in LGED and identify the information and capacity gaps and knowledge needs for the design of a knowledge management program. Engagement with the private sector will also be a key activity of the PPTA in designing the interventions and knowledge management program. We are aware of German Bilateral Cooperation in coastal areas. We will closely coordinate with Germany in implementing the project to avoid overlap with existing and upcoming bilateral projects. We look forward to work with KfW for possible financial cooperation for the ensuing project.
