The Pilot Program for Climate Resilience (PPCR)

- The Pilot Program for Climate Resilience is one of the Climate Investment Funds (CIFs) established as interim funds prior to the new Fast Start Financing and the future Green Climate Funds
- It includes 9 pilot countries and 2 regions (Caribbean and Pacific)
- Africa Pilots include Zambia, Mozambique and Niger
- Ministry of Finance and National Planning signed Phase 1 of PPCR on June 14, 2010.

Zambia and Climate Change Funds

- Under the PPCR, Zambia is entitled to US\$40-50 million Grant financing and up to US\$60 million in concessionary funds to help climate proof priority investment priorities under the Sixth National Development Plan (total up to US\$110 million)
- The PPCR would support Zambia's broader Climate Change Program
- Due to its LDC status, Zambia presently qualifies for many of the global climate funds which are being used to channel the **US\$30 billion** "Fast Track" Climate Financing pledged in Copenhagen for 2010-2012.
- Many of these funds will be channeled through Climate Investment Funds, GEF, UN-REDD, and bilateral sources (Japan, Sweden, Norway, US, etc)
 - Zambia has a vested interest in setting up urgently its institutional and funding structures to absorb these funds when it is still qualifies under most funding windows.






Key Outcomes of PPCR Joint Mission November 15-30, 2010

- In Barotse: canal management








Proposed Components of Zambia's Strategic Program for Climate Resilience

 - Ecosystem management





Mission Recommendations



• Given the importance and urgency of reaching closure on the institutional framework for climate change in Zambia, the mission recommends that the PS of the three leading Ministries – MOFNP, MTENR, and OVP convene under the Secretary to the Cabinet to reach a final agreement



Priority Follow-up Actions



- It is critical not to lose momentum national stakeholders and contributing partners are highly motivated but they need MoFNP strong leadership in PPCR Phase I
- Mission recommends that MoFNP establish urgently a joint PPCR/CCFU Secretariat in a neutral space centrally located where stakeholders and Platforms can continue to operate Assist Platforms to operate by reviewing and approving 6-months work plans (under PPCR Phase 1).
- Mobilize urgently key positions for PPCR Phase I (FMS, Technical Officer, Crowdsourcing Expert) and equipment for Secretariat
- Convene a Workshop in January to finalize Strategic Investment Framework for Climate Resilience
- Carry out an institutional assessment mission to Western Province

Target SPCR submission (up to US\$110 million) for PPCR Sub-Committee approval by March-June 2011.
