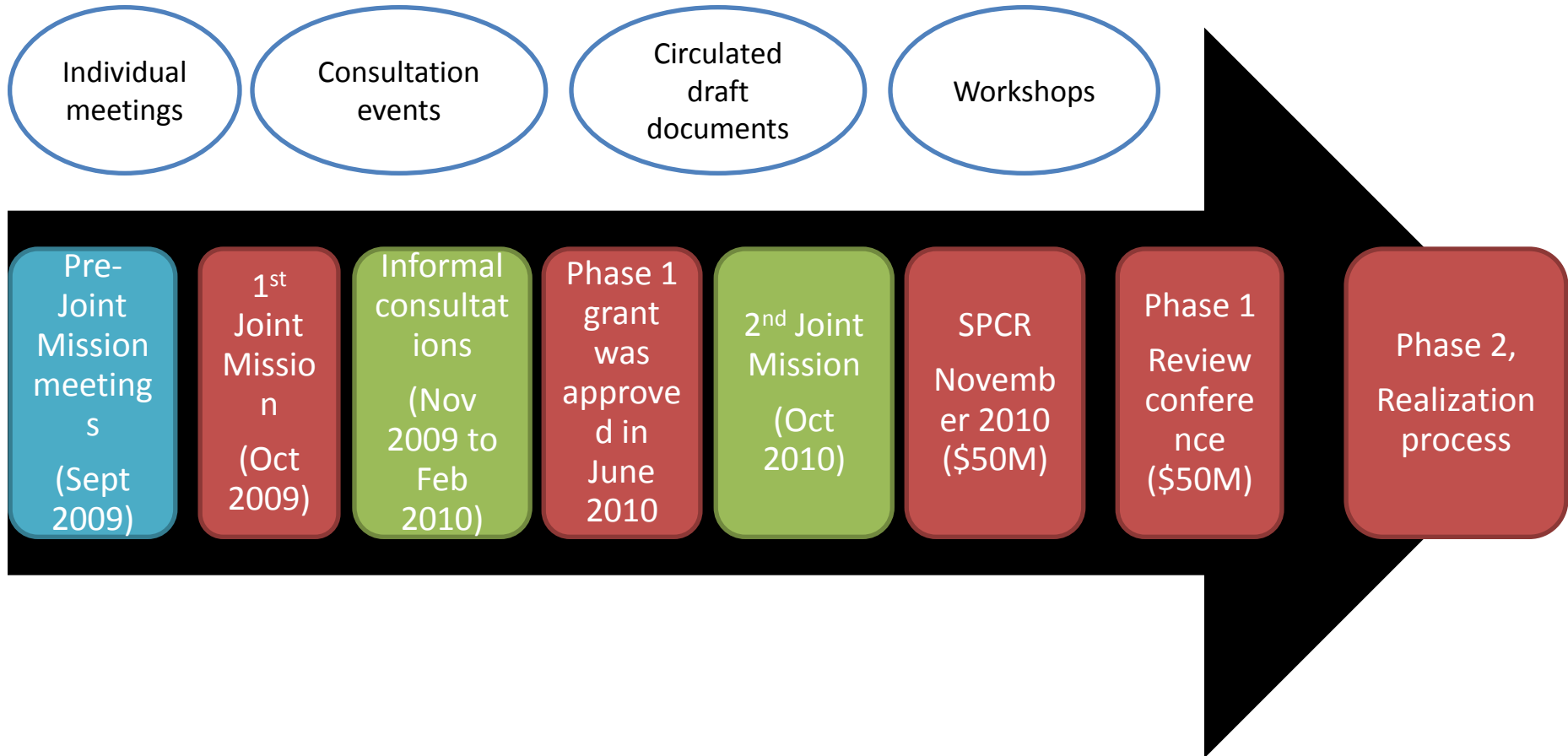


PPCR in Tajikistan

- Started in May 2009;
- First stock-taking visit in Sept 2009
- 1st Joint Mission in October 2009 to identify priorities
- Mid-term mission in March 2010 to design Phase 1 work
- 2nd Joint Mission in October 2010 to design Phase 2 work
- Phase 1 grant was approved in June 2010 (\$1.5M)
- Strategic Programme for Climate Resilience approved in November 2010 (\$50M)



Process: Continuous Consultation

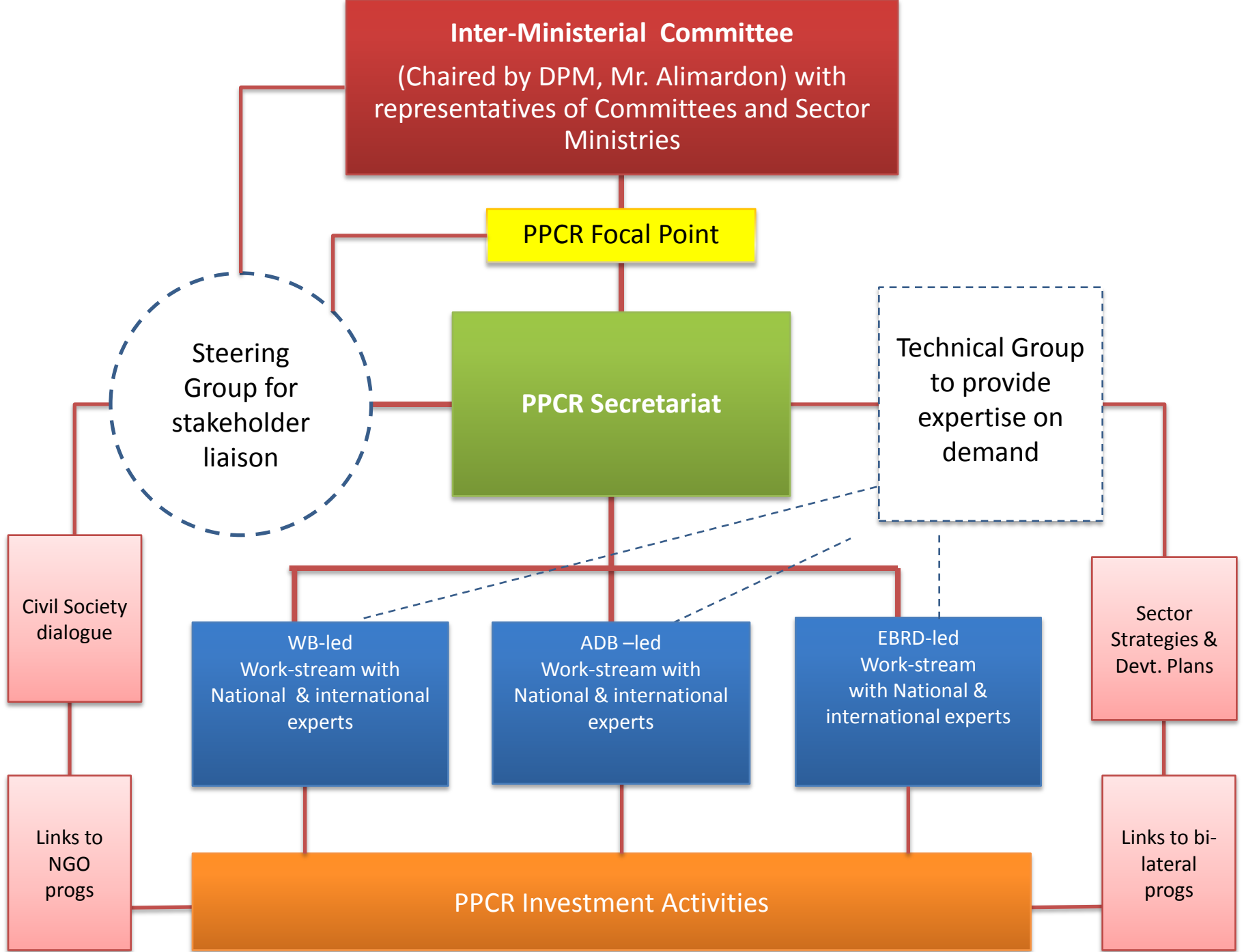


Phase 1 Activities: complete

1. Review of institutional arrangements and capacity needs;
2. Raising awareness of climate change in Tajikistan;
3. Climate Science and Impact Modeling Partnership;
4. Options for enhancing the climate resilience of the energy sector;
5. Analysis of sustainable land management approaches;
6. River basin approaches to climate resilience

Phase 2 Activities: on going

1. Building Capacity for Climate Resilience;
2. Improvement of Weather, Climate and Hydrological Service;
3. Climate Science and Modelling Programme ;
4. Enhancing the Climate Resilience of the energy sector;
5. Sustainable Land Management;
6. Building climate Resilience in the Pyanj River ;

PPCR secretariat

- Established in March 2011 by Deputy Prime Minister to provide additional capacity to government
- Bridging finance of \$100,000 for Year 1 up to March 2012 provided by ADB
- To be supported by capacity building TA from 2012 to 2016

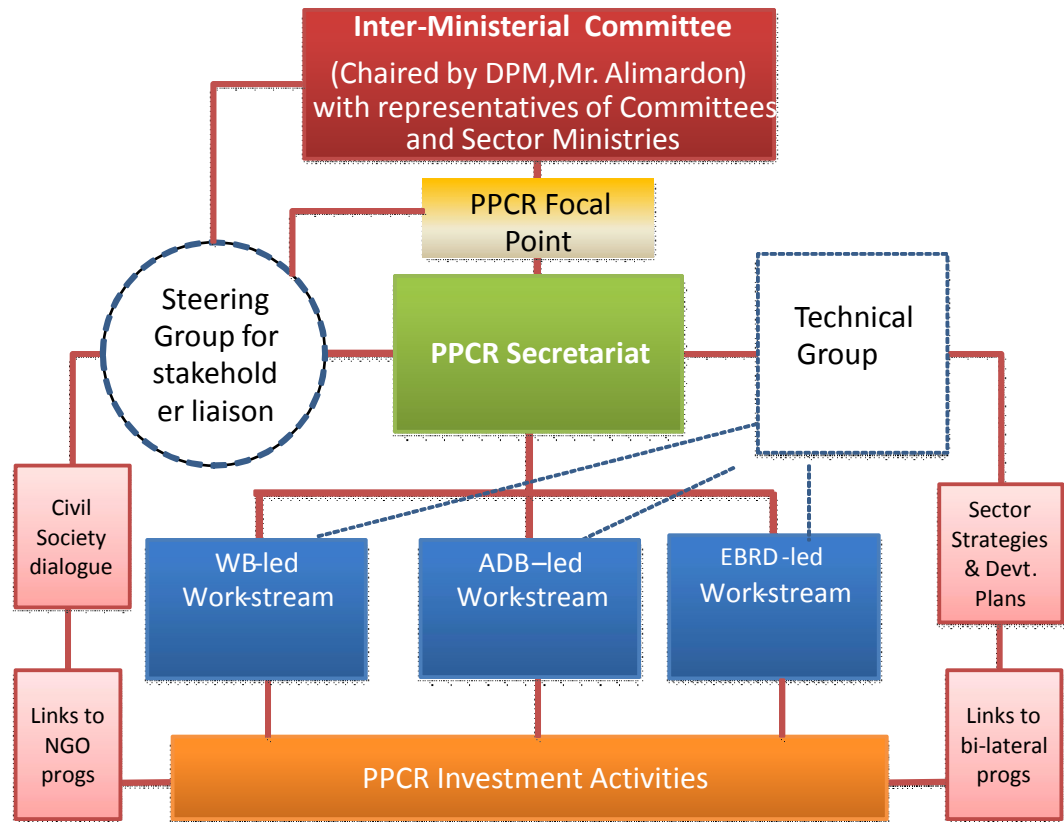


Secretariat responsibilities

- *Coordination* to facilitate alignment of new and ongoing activities on climate change adaptation being implemented by stakeholders in Tajikistan;
- *Communication and outreach* to ensure high awareness of PPCR activities and dissemination of PPCR knowledge products
- *Sustained stakeholder engagement* to ensure that PPCR activities take into account the views of a wide range of stakeholders through meaningful consultation;
- *Monitoring & Evaluation* to ensure efficiency, relevance and sustainability of PPCR

Establishment of a Secretariat for PPCR

Reasons for establishment of a Secretariat

- Need for structure and co-ordination widely recognised by Government, MDBs, NGOs and other stakeholders;
- Especially important in the transition from current Phase 1 (analytical work) to Phase 2 (investments);
- AEA consultants, funded by DFID, provided co-ordination during the start up phase (18months) - this ended as the Secretariat* became operational;

Key Responsibilities of PPCR Secretariat

- Ownership* and Leadership of PPCR will rest with the GoT, and be coordinated through Secretariat;
- Central co-ordination for PPCR – Make space for dialogue; seek synergies amongst stakeholders including civil society organizations and help MDBs identify critical dependencies between activities;
- Monitor and report progress across the PPCR; but will not substitute for project-specific task, financial management and procurement functions;
- Communication & Dissemination: Consult widely and broadly with bilateral donors, international organisations and civil society;
- Provide central channel (through Focal Point) for consultations on Phase 2 investments, in addition to project-specific outreach;
- Training & Capacity Building for Government and stakeholder bodies – assess needs of different groups, develop proposals for training and capacity building, identify service providers.

PPCR Coordination Mechanism

* First years funding for Secretariat staff and activities are provided by ADB. Funding for subsequent years will come from Phase 2 'Building Capacity for Climate Resilience' component.

About PPCR

The Pilot Program for Climate Resilience (PPCR), approved in November 2008, was the first program developed and operational under the Strategic Climate Fund (SCF), which is one of two funds within the design of the Climate Investment Funds (CIF).

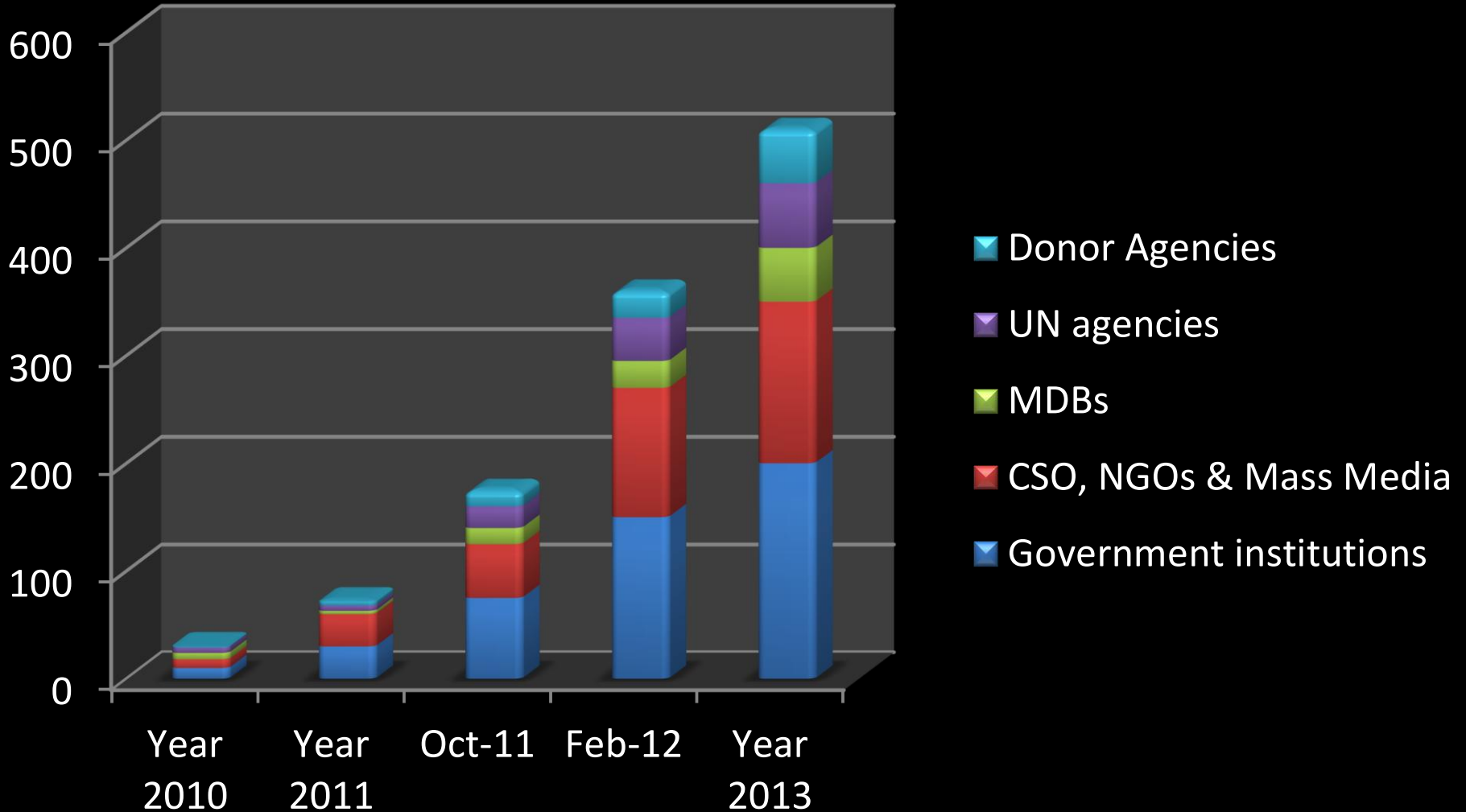
The PPCR aims to pilot and demonstrate ways in which climate risk and resilience may be integrated into core development planning and implementation. In this way, the PPCR provides incentives for scaled-up action and initiates transformational change.

The pilot programs and projects implemented under the PPCR are country-led, build on National Adaptation Programs of Action (NAPA) and other relevant country studies and strategies. They are strategically aligned with other donor funded activities to provide financing for projects that will produce experience and knowledge useful to designing scaled-up adaptation measures.

Key anticipated responsibilities of PPCR Secretariat (*Year 2*)

- **Central coordination for PPCR** – Facilitate Phase 2 implementation; Promote dialogue; support the work of the Coordination Mechanism; seek synergies amongst stakeholders, including CSO, and help Government identify critical dependencies between activities
- **Communication & dissemination:** consult widely, collate results and documents, produce knowledge products and disseminate information and outputs
- **Establish and maintain a monitoring system** across the PPCR as a coordinating function to raise efficiency of project implementation and meet objectives; conduct annual reviews
- **Support the delivery of capacity building TA**

Some of the Next Steps

1. Complete Review of PPCR Secretariat Year 1 – Mar2012
2. Finalize Secretariat work plan for year 2012-2013 and a 4-year work plan for Phase 2 in dialogue with stakeholders – Apr2012
3. Produce a Phase 1 Lessons Learned Report – June2012
4. Make Coordination Mechanism operational – Sept2012
5. Support recruitment of new staff – Mar2013
6. Strengthen PPCR Secretariat capacity to become a Government implementing agency for climate change projects in Tajikistan – Mar2014

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
