

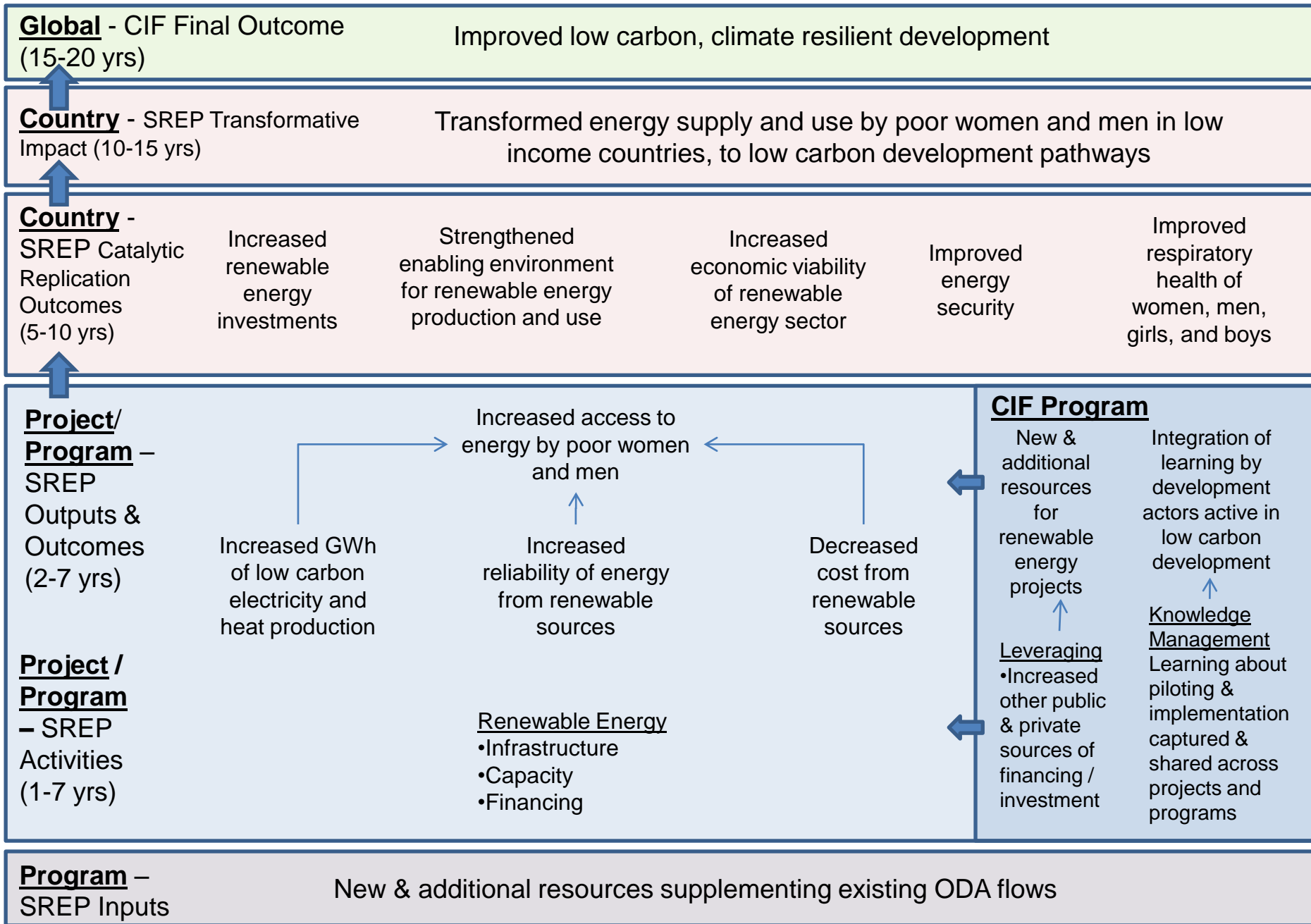

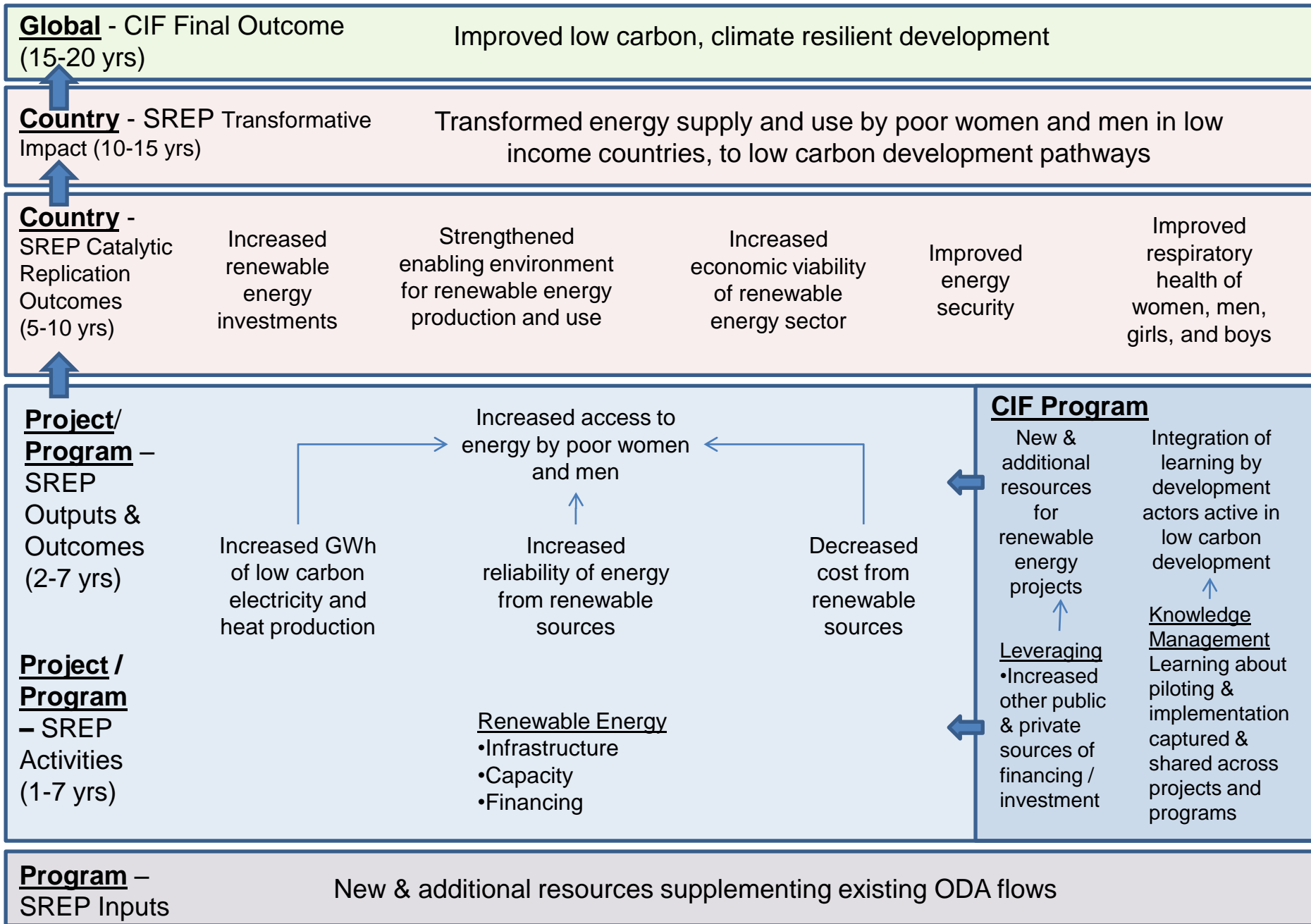
Logic Model: Scaling Up Renewable Energy Program in Low Income Countries (SREP)

- ❖ Living document
- ❖ Field testing
- ❖ Operate within (i) national monitoring and evaluation systems; and (ii) MDBs' own managing for development results (MfDR) approach
- ❖ Flexible and pragmatic approach
- ❖ Data collection and reporting standards
