## Comments from the United Kingdom on the Approval by mail of PPCR Funding Grenada: Proposal for Phase 1 Funding

## Dear Patricia

Thank you very much for sharing this with us. We welcome proposal and endorse it now, subject to addressing the below comments:

We welcome the proposed alignment of the SPCR with the National Climate Change Policy and Action Plan.

The proposal is weak on analysis in some places and some data gathered from the stock take and included in joint mission reports is missing. It will be important to set out the analysis clearly both in the phase 1 proposal that moves into implementation, and in the SPCR.

There is little evidence of a specific focus on the most vulnerable communities or on gender issues, and this could be brought out more clearly in the Phase 1 proposal and SPCR.

There is little analysis of the cost-effectiveness of the Phase I proposal, apart from the justification for using technical specialists to supplement government human resources. It will be important during Phase I to include mechanisms for achieving cost-effectiveness in the SPCR.

Arrangements for monitoring, evaluation and impact assessment will need to be developed at an early stage of Phase 1, and should include early actions to establish baselines against which project progress can be measured.

We welcome the large number of civil society groups that were involved during the development of the PPCR proposal and the National Climate Change Policy and Action Plan that underpins it. However, these tended to represent technical and commercial stakeholders and there is less mention of consultation with vulnerable communities. It will be important to ensure broad engagement in the development and delivery of the SPCR.

It will be important to ensure broad private sector engagement in the development and delivery of the SPCR.

We would be happy to make further comments available to those leading on the proposal, including a short independent assessment we commissioned to help us understand how well the proposal meets the objectives of the PPCR.
