PPCR Objectives

- Show how to integrate climate risk & resilience into development
- Strengthen national capacities
- Scale up investment building on ongoing work
- Learn-by-doing; share lessons learned
- Regional PPCRs – strengthen regional cooperation



PPCR Principles

- Country-led and country-driven – there are no *blue prints*
- Build on NAPAs
- Strategically aligned with adaptation funds
- Support actions consistent with national development goals



PPCR Expected Outcomes

- Stronger integration into national development planning and implementation
- National consensus on approaches
- Increased financing
- Increased learning and knowledge sharing



PPCR Countries/Regions

- Independent Expert Group appointed
- 8 countries invited in January 2009 & additional country in May
- Invited 2 regions

* The timing of formulation of the investment program varies by country; it could be right after the joint mission or may require a longer time for dialogue ("no blue print")



Country Examples



PPCR in Nepal

- Joint ADB-IFC-WB Mission: 3-9 September
- **Objectives:** Take stock of the range of climate change-related and agree with Government on the process and scope of PPCR activities
- **Positive outcomes:** Identified current climate change activities and possible links with PPCR-NAPA, REDD, DRM, water resources management, community-based vulnerability assessment and action planning initiatives



PPCR in Nepal

Themes on building climate resilience:

Multi-sectoral approach and bottom-up initiatives

Government priorities for PPCR:

Implementation and investment rather than studies and policy/planning documents;
possible focus of PPCR to address nexus of forestry/water/agriculture.



PPCR in Cambodia

Joint ADB-WB-IFC-UNDP Mission: 12-22 October

Objectives: review progress and provide a platform for a strategic program for integrating climate resilience into development

Key challenges: Mobilizing well-balanced support from key stakeholders; designing a program that ensures synergies and avoids duplication of GCCA program funded by EC

Positive outcomes: Strong enthusiasm for participation; broad consensus on priority sectors and areas of support



PPCR in Cambodia

Institutional arrangements:

- MEF - overall project oversight and monitoring
- NCCC - Executing Agency
- Line Ministries - Implementing agencies

Priority sectors:

- Agriculture
- Water resources
- Rural infrastructure



PPCR in Cambodia

Priority activities

- Technical support for mainstreaming climate resilience planning and budgeting
- Piloting vulnerability and adaptation assessments and investments on an ecosystem basis
- Strengthening data collection on climate risks
- Focusing on cost-effective integrated solutions
- Promoting participation of the private sector and civil society
- Alignment of PPCR with MDB and other development partner investments



PPCR in Tajikistan

Joint ADB-EBRD-WB Mission - 12-22 October

Objectives: Take stock of the scope of current CCA threats and adaptation activities with stakeholders; create platform environment for PPCR dialogue; develop collaborative process required to prepare the SPCR

Priority sectors/themes: water security, energy and livelihood security, downscaled hydromet modelling capacity and data management, DRR and CCA synergies, irrigation, land degradation, cross-sector policy framework, & institutional capacity-building.



PPCR in Tajikistan

Institutional arrangements:

- **Executive Office of the Prime Minister – primary lead**
- **Line Ministries – Implementing agencies**
- **Department/Centre for Environmental and Emergency Situations (Executive Office of President) – PPCR Focal**
- **Strong Central Government support**
