### Overview

A risk appetite statement (RAS) is an articulation of the amount or risk an organization is willing to take.

• An RAS can be regarded as a <u>limit/ceiling</u> to the amount of a given risk which may be taken.

## Context

An RAS is impacted by the program's:

- Objectives
- External Context
- Internal Context

## Risk Appetite Levels

Appetite/tolerance for a given risk may be classified as either Low (which includes risks for which there is no appetite/zero tolerance), Medium, or High based on their expected likelihood and severity.

#### **Impact**

Likelihood	Minimal	Moderate	Severe
Very Likely	Low	High	High
Likely	Low	High	High
Possible	Low	Medium	High
Unlikely	Low	Low	Medium
Very Unlikely	Low	Low	Low

## **Risk Categories**
