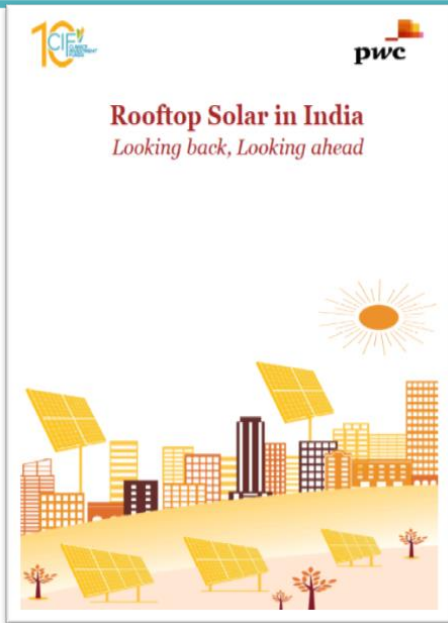

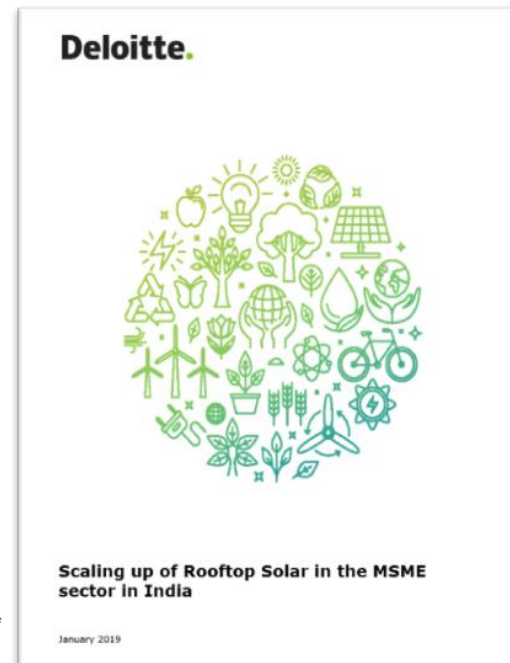
## LOOKING BACK

- India, with ambitious renewable energy goals, is also the largest recipient of CTF funding, with solar as the largest share (incl. \$300m in rooftop solar via ADB & WB).
- CIF carried out a study on RTS looking at the role of CTF funding and the RTS market in the context of other markets incl. China, Germany and US.

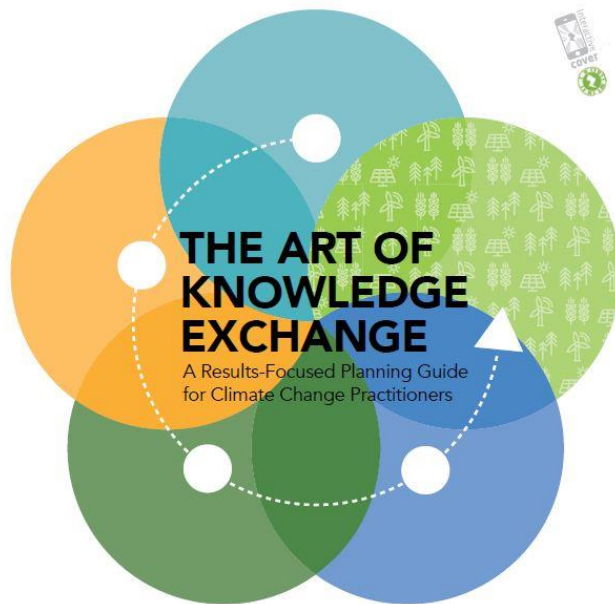
## LOOKING AHEAD

- MSME sector is a key pillar of economy contributing about 17% of GDP, accounting for 45% of manufacturing output and 40% of exports. However, it is marred by lack of credit worthiness and other issues.
- Under E&L, CIF is looking into ways to address key barriers and identify appropriate financial framework to help scale up RTS in the sector and help India meet its renewable energy goal.

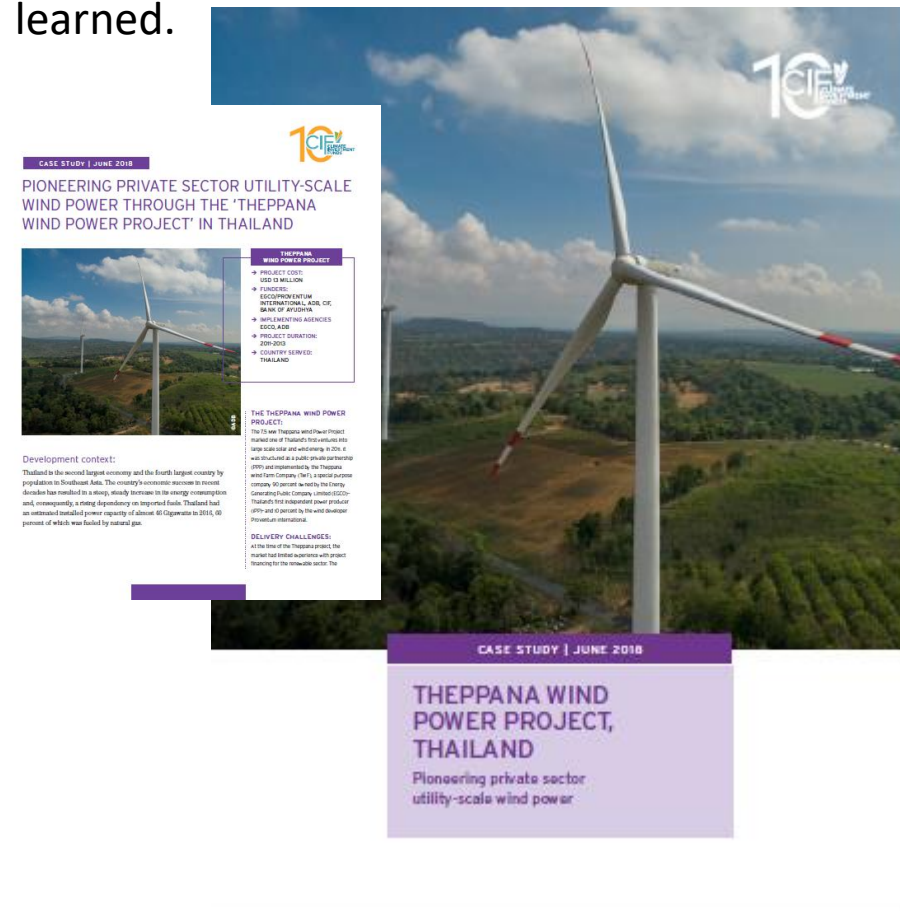
