
FIP COUNTRY PORTFOLIO

FOREST INVESTMENT PROGRAM - COUNTRY PORTFOLIO

- 1. The COUNTRY PORTFOLIO is an information document and is a supplement to the semi-annual operations report providing project information and status for each of the country supported by FIP. The country summary gives a snapshot of the overall endorsed funding, approvals and co-financing with detailed breakdown under the project list. A brief progress update for each project is also provided. Project data is as of 30 December 2016 with the most recent information on project submissions and approvals covering the period of January to March 2017.
- 2. In the June 2016 meetings, committee members requested for more substantive information on the circumstances of the projects specifically on submission and approval delays and slow disbursement. To address this, the CIF AU worked on identifying the pertinent reasons for submission delay and the possible causes of low disbursement (see Annex A). MDBs gave their share of the process by providing inputs (project-by-project basis) on remedial measures to fast track project clearances and by sharing information on disbursement deviation and planned actions to ramp up funds utilization. All of these were encapsulated in the country portfolio with additional details in the implementation status of projects in the advanced stage.

The project is about 18 months behind schedule but is making good progress especially at the strategic level. Partnerships between the FIP and specific government agencies or other ministries – SPCNDD, Decentralization (MATDSI), rural land tenure management (DGFOMR)) have been identified and greater collaboration is being fostered to leverage more action. The creation of a General Directorate on Green Economy and Climate Change integrating REDD+ now provides the Ministry of Environment with an adequate body to implement and supervise the project's REDD+ activities. Regarding the REDD+ Readiness agenda, the project is moving on several fronts; the local consultations have been prepared but still need to be carried out. The recruitment of the Measurement, Reporting, and Verification (MRV) team is ongoing. Finally, the road map for the studies on "factors of deforestation and strategy" has been clarified and 3 experts for coordinating the work will be recruited in the coming 3 months. The studies will then have to be procured and implemented. Regarding the local development component, the local participatory diagnostics in each of the 32 communes using an innovative methodology ("Terristories" from a French research institute, CIRAD) has been completed. The development of communal REDD+ investment projects aligned with the land use plans, as opposed to sporadic micro-projects, is taking shape. Firms/NGOs in charge of helping communities develop their REDD+ investment projects still need to be hired. Positive linkages were made with private investors seeking to develop "carbon" projects in Burkina Faso. This could pave the way for a future program on carbon emission reduction that would integrate such "carbon" projects as champions and be based on the investments at the communal level.



Coordination and communication systems were established to enable development of work plans and monitoring of performance of activities. E.g., communication protocols and regular meetings of the Project Management Unit / Project Coordinating Unit (with focal persons from the implementing agencies). This "platform" of institutional collaboration is now in position to enable faster, more coordinated implementation going forward. On the ground, work was initiated with the Community Resource Management Areas (CREMAs) and cocoa farmers. Many cocoa farmers have been registered according to their willingness to work with the project. Training has been provided to a number of cocoa extension agents, also communication and outreach materials (e.g. radio programs) were developed, some specifically focused on promoting shade cocoa and countering the "myth" of unshaded cocoa. Local training events and workshops, organized by the Ghana Cocoa Board, were also attended by the Forestry Commission field and district staff, furthering cooperation between the two institutions. Large areas were surveyed and potential sites for plantation development were identified. Tree planting started as enrichment planting in degraded watersheds; establishment of model plantations; and boundary planting for forest reserves. Community sensitization on good tree planting practices started, and tree seedlings were distributed to small holder farmers as part of landscape rehabilitation efforts. Overall, FIP forms an integral part of Ghana's REDD+ agenda where FIP investments are seen a pilots f







CAA presented an expression of interest and, due to its work in the Project, was selected to be part of the thematic group for Fund Raising and Distribution of Non-Reimburseble Funds.
