









### Gender


- FIP portfolio of IPs and projects approved by FIP Sub-Committee from January 1 to June 30, 2018 reviewed for gender "quality at entry".
- Country programming support to the WB (DGM) and AfDB (Ghana) to do research on women integration and participation.

### **Dedicated Grant Mechanism**

- 8 country projects, 1 global project under implementation.
- USD 50M approved (66% of allocated funds).
- 10 National Steering Committees, and 1 Global Steering Committee established (more than 240 members involved).
- 8 National Executing Agencies selected.
- 1346 subproject proposals received, 207 subprojects approved (15.4% of demand).
- 8 learning exchanges (regional and global), 196 participants from more than 100 networks and organizations.

## Dedicated Grant Mechanism - Highlights



- Intangible impacts: increased trust, ownership, empowering governance
- Brazil: launch of online monitoring system,
- DRC: partnerships with key IPLC organizations to support for advocacy on DRC's Indigenous Peoples Law,
- Burkina Faso: 60% of sub-projects beneficiaries are women; 38% of sub-projects implemented by and supporting women's groups.




# Common Themes: Overall Targets and Progress by Year






# Common Themes: Overall Targets and Progress by Year

#### Tenure:


• FIP supports countries on defining rights to use, control, and transfer land and forest resources.

#### Capacity development


• All FIP countries made progress, including technical assistance, employment opportunities, trainings and provision of equipment.


Knowledge products/information management systems c:3; p:3. Cumulative progress: 83%
