

**INFORMATION SHARING AND OUTREACH EVENTS CONVENED SINCE THE ENDORSEMENT OF THE INDONESIA FIP INVESTMENT PLAN IN NOVEMBER 2012<sup>1</sup>**

Submission by the Asian Development Bank and the World Bank Group

Date	Description
<b>November 3, 2012</b>	IFC FIP team met with WWF Indonesia Forestry staff to review survey report on forestry SMEs in Aceh province. Report was commissioned by IFC to identify suitable forestry enterprises involved in community forestry concession (HTR) development.
<b>November 20, 2012</b>	IFC FIP team visited plantation company at West Kalimantan to assess opportunities to collaborate on community forestry enterprise activities related to outgrower based wood production and use of plantation wood for development of small scale charcoal production for commercial use.
<b>November 21-22, 2012</b>	ADB FIP team discuss with the Ministry of Forestry regarding next steps for processing the ADB project. Discussions were also held with the WWF staff to know current developments on REDD+ in Kalimantan. Discussion also focused on the need for the National Forest Council (DKN) to conduct further stakeholder consultations based on guidance from FIP subcommittee.
<b>November 23, 2012</b>	ADB FIP team discussed opportunities for collaboration with Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) in design and implementation of FIP project in West Kalimantan. Both technical and co-financing possibilities were discussed.
<b>December 13 &amp; 26-27, 2012</b>	A World Bank task team visited the Yogyakarta KPH and two KPHs in Lampung to meet with local government representatives and stakeholders in the KPH (private sector, community representatives). Objective of the field missions was to gather information about several aspects of KPHs relevant to project design, consultations and preparation.
<b>January 15, 2013</b>	World Bank met with French Development Agency (AFD) representatives in Jakarta to learn about their past experience working with KPHs and also to explain objectives of FIP investments. Explored possibility of cooperation and synergy, particularly in AFD-supported KPHs in Lampung province.
<b>January 28, 2013</b>	ADB FIP team discussed cooperation with representatives of GIZ in design and implementation FIP project in West Kalimantan. Progress in FMU

<sup>1</sup> This list includes only events initiated by the three Multilateral Development Banks (MDBs) – the World Bank, the International Finance Corporation (IFC), and the Asian Development Bank (ADB) – who are in their early stages of developing projects with the Government of Indonesia under the FIP. The list is not exhaustive; the Government has conducted a large number of their own consultation and outreach events related to the Forest Management Unit (KPH) agenda and the FIP. The above events also do not represent the entirety of consultations and outreach for the FIP in Indonesia. Additional consultation processes will be conducted at the national and regional levels to inform the design of each of the individual MDB-supported projects. These formal preparation processes are scheduled to commence before the end of 2013.

<b>February 25, 2013</b>	World Bank and Kemitraan representatives meet to discuss potential for Kemitraan to prepare World Bank-managed project on behalf of MOFOR. This process would entail national- and regional-level consultations on behalf of MOFOR, outreach to stakeholders and receipt of design inputs during the formal FIP project preparation phase prior to World Bank appraisal.
<b>February 28 and March 1, 2013</b>	ADB FIP team held meetings with selected staff of West Kalimantan province and representatives of local NGOs and private sector to inform them of endorsement of forest investment plan and various steps for design of the FIP project.
<b>March 13, 2013</b>	DKN Preparation Meeting in Bogor on programmatic engagement with the World Bank, including for preparation process for the FIP and the DGM
<b>March 26, 2013</b>	ADB FIP team discussed with WWF representatives regarding the needs of local communities in protection and conservation forest areas in Kalimantan and opportunities for livelihood improvement through FIP.
<b>April 4, 2013</b>	IFC FIP team visited KPH Yogyakarta to view small enterprise development activities and understand business models adopted.
<b>April 10, 2013</b>	All MDBs and the government representatives discussed the establishment of FIP steering committee by the Secretary General of the Ministry of Forestry. MDBs requested for inclusion of civil society representatives on the steering committee.
<b>April 11, 2013</b>	ADB FIP team discussed with staff of Bogor Agricultural University regarding tenure and livelihood opportunities in Kalimantan.
<b>May 15-18, 2013</b>	World Bank task team field mission to the Berau district. Objective of the field mission was the same as above for the Yogyakarta and Lampung missions, with the added goal of disseminating information about the FIP to and learning from the Nature Conservancy (TNC) and GIZ, who are both promoting KPH institutional development as part of broader assistance programs in and around Berau.
<b>May 21, 2013</b>	ADB FIP team discussed with selected stakeholders regarding national and sub-national fiscal policies for carbon stock improvement in Indonesia and other parts of Southeast Asia.
<b>May 22, 2013</b>	Internal DKN meeting with the objective to prepare a consultation plan and discuss Investment Plan and DGM guidance for the setting-up of a National

	Steering Committee meeting (convened on June 27-28, 2013, see below).
<b>June 17-20, 2013</b>	ADB FIP team discussed with representatives of civil society organizations on FIP in Indonesia and Lao PDR. ADB organized a special session on 18 June focusing on “Social Forestry and FIP” as part of the 4 <sup>th</sup> ASEAN Social Forestry Network Conference – Village Forests, TREDD+, Conservation and Livelihoods, held in Luang Prabang, Lao PDR.
<b>June 20, 2013</b>	GIZ Forclime and Directorate for KPH Development convene a roundtable discussion with donors on the Government's KPH development agenda, where the Government discussed its plans and donors explained the status of their various projects in support of KPHs. World Bank presented an update on the KPH support project under the Indonesia Investment Plan.
<b>June 21, 2013</b>	MOFOR Directorate for KPH Development socialization with relevant government ministries and agencies on their work plans and agenda. Objectives of the event were to provide information on FIP investment projects to government stakeholders and agree on preparation activities needed to appraise FIP project.
<b>June 26, 2013</b>	ADB FIP team discussed with representatives of JICA, Australia and US on opportunities for potential collaboration in design and implementation of ADB FIP project in West Kalimantan. Progress on FIP was also discussed with staff of the National Council of Climate Change (DNPI) and the Nature Conservancy.
<b>June 27-28, 2013</b>	<p>DKN National Dialogue on the DGM and the FIP. The Ministry of Forestry convened a national-level consultation via the DKN to discuss critically the final investment plan and disseminate information on next steps regarding the preparation process for the individual projects. The event also discussed next steps regarding the consultation on the individual programs under each of the MDBs as well as the role and responsibilities of the DKN. At least 110 people attended, including members of the DKN Presidium, as well as representatives from communities of FMU territories, local communities, and civil society organizations. <b>July 19, 2013</b>	DKN follow-up meeting in Yogyakarta to address the result of the National Dialogue on FIP in Bogor 28 June 2013.
<b>July 25-26 , 2013</b>	Ministry of Forestry and ADB FIP team met to discuss activities under components 1 and 2 of the ADB FIP project.
<b>July 31, 2013</b>	Ministry of Forestry and ADB FIP team met to discuss activities under component 3 of the ADB FIP project.
<b>August 21 and 22, 2013</b>	ADB FIP team held meetings with representatives of AusAID, JICA and others regarding opportunities for collaboration in FIP in West Kalimantan.
<b>September 3 and 4, 2013</b>	ADB FIP team participated in 7 <sup>th</sup> Trilateral Meeting of the Heart of Borneo Initiative and informed nearly 200 stakeholders (representing governments of Indonesia, Brunei and Malaysia, development partners, civil society

	organizations and the private sector) regarding planned activities under FIP project in Kalimantan.
<b>September 4, 2013</b>	IFC participates in Forestry Sector Dialogue sponsored by the Indonesia Forest Producers Association (APHI). Several national CSOs were in attendance. Among other topics discussed affecting private sector, there was concern expressed about the need to actively manage logged over Production Forest and to prevent these forests from being converted to plantations or removed from the forestry estate. Strengthening the network of KPHs was mentioned as one way to improve the condition of logged over forest.
<b>September 6, 2013</b>	ADB FIP team attended the Ministerial meeting of the Heart of Borneo Initiative as an observer and informed the ministers of forestry and other stakeholders including civil society organizations regarding FIP interventions in West Kalimantan and potential options for positively influencing livelihoods of local communities.
<b>September 6, 2013</b>	IFC FIP team met with MOFOR and other GoI agencies involved in FIP. An update was provided on the process to develop the private sector FIP project concept, links to KPHs, and timeline for project preparation and proposal development.
<b>September 11 and 12, 2013</b>	MOFOR Directorate of KPH Development convened a national workshop to promote its KPH institutional development agenda to regional Ministry of Forestry offices and local provincial and district government forest units. There was also a brief discussion on the FIP program objectives.
<b>September 19, 2013</b>	Informal lunch with CSOs previously critical of the FIP to update them on the individual projects' preparation. In attendance were representatives from the three MDBs. CSOs invited included Greenpeace, Walhi, HuMa, Debt Watch, Solidaritas Perempuan, CSF for Climate Justice, Global Witness. Issues discussed included recap of 27-28 June Bogor meeting on FIP/DKN, FIP Pilot Country Meeting in Yogyakarta, progress update on FIP and DKN engagement
<b>September 24-26, 2013</b>	FIP Pilot Countries Meeting. MOFOR received critical inputs from several CSOs – none who had attended September 19 informal lunch – after a small demonstration outside of the venue hotel in Yogyakarta. Their concerns were related to the FIP programmatic design and objectives. MOFOR clarified it's the FIP program's objectives in a press statement which was picked up by local media.
<b>November 2012 to September 2013</b>	Over the period, the IFC FIP team met with 12 forestry enterprises from across Indonesia to explore advisory and investment needs and opportunities. The meetings provided input for the development of the FIP private sector project concept, which will aim to focus on strengthening supply chains between forest product manufacturers and upstream wood suppliers of different sizes.
