# Updates from Pilot Countries: Advances, Challenges and Lessons

- Yemen, Niger, and Nepal all advanced their institutional arrangements for management, coordination, and implementation
- Haiti, Mozambique and St. Lucia all noted lack of hydromet and climate data as being a major constraint for adaptation planning
- Bangladesh, Tajikistan and others shared lessons on the value (and cost) of continuous communication, awareness raising and engagement with stakeholders (including gov.)

- Linking SPCR to broader national processes and strategies

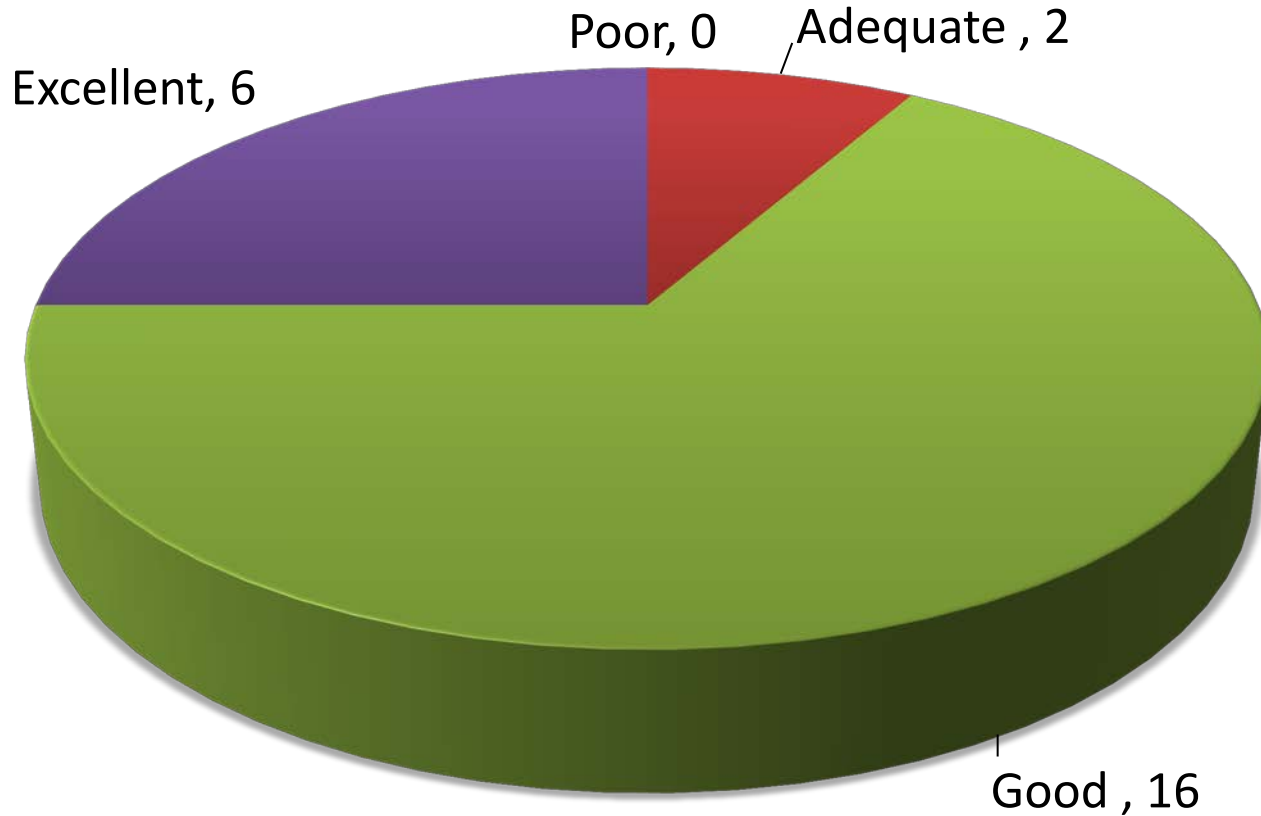
# PPCR Learning Product

# PPCR M&E Showcases: Cambodia and Mozambique

- Countries have started M&E working groups to integrate PPCR M&E into national systems
- Good timing:
  - Cambodia is working on the next national development strategic plan
  - Mozambique is working on national climate change strategy and management unit
- Key messages:
  - System should serve broader national needs
  - Integration takes time and resources
  - Data challenges
