PPRC Process and Status



- Results framework provisionally approved by the PPCR-SC in May 2009
- PPCR results framework now part of larger harmonization of the CIF results framework
- Harmonization paper is being consider by the PPCR-SC at this October meeting

PPCR Program Objectives



- Pilot and demonstrate approaches for integration of climate risk and resilience into development policies and planning
- Strengthen capacities at the national levels to integrate climate resilience into development planning
- Scale-up and leverage climate-resilient investments, building and other ongoing initiatives
- Enable learning-by-doing and sharing of lessons learning at the country, regional and global levels
- For the PPCR pilot countries – Aim to strengthen cooperation and capacity at the regional level to integrate climate resilience into development planning and processes

The PPCR Results Framework



- Logic model
- Performance measurement framework (PMF)
- Guiding questions to assess the process of development and the investments proposed in the Strategic Program for Climate Resilience (SPCR) to ensure consistency with PPCR objectives

The Logic Model



- Provides a graphic illustration of how the PPCR program will lead, influence and contribute to the achievement of the expected outcomes
- It illustrates the “what” as in: what is expected to be done (outputs) and the results (outcomes) it intends to generate

Ultimate Outcome

Increased application of knowledge on integration of climate resilience into development

Intermediate Outcomes

Improved integration of climate resilience into planning, processes, and implementation (as appropriate to each country)

Increased consensus on an approach to climate resilient development appropriate to each country

Increased finance availability (e.g., scaled-up investment commitment) in approaches to climate resilient development

Enhanced learning and knowledge sharing on integration of climate resilience into development

Immediate Outcome

Increased capacity to integrate climate resilience into country strategies

More inclusive strategies for climate resilient development

Increased awareness of impacts of climate change among governments and non-government stakeholders

Increased access to financing for broader programming of integrating climate resilience into national/sectoral development plans and budgeting

Improved coordination among key stakeholders to implement programs

International community is better informed on PPCR lessons learned

Outputs

- Technical support & training provided, such as on M&E, economic analyses
- Technical support provided based on respective Strategic Program for Climate Resilience & its components

- Participatory approaches developed and implemented
- Relevant stakeholders consulted (civil society, NGOS, private sector, non-state actors, academia, vulnerable and marginalized groups)

- Systems for information management established or improved (data collection, analysis, synthesis, dissemination)
- Vulnerability and risk assessments conducted
- Dissemination of studies, results in local languages completed

- Programmatic approaches for climate resilience in different sectors and contexts implemented
- Instruments for managing climate risks on vulnerable sectors developed and adopted (e.g., early warning system for drought)

- Institutional arrangements for coordination established/strengthened at country level (i.e., cross-sectoral)
- Mechanisms for coordination with external partners established

- Learning process established through Global Support Program to capture & disseminate lessons learned (based on pilots)
- Dissemination of lessons through a range of channels, such as regional workshops, Web site, the Partnership forum, training-of-trainer programs etc.

Performance Measurement Framework (PMF)



- It is a plan to:
 - Systematically collect relevant data over the lifetime of an investment, and
 - Assess and demonstrate progress made towards the expected results
- It focuses on outcomes to measure results
 - Outputs should be covered in work plans
- Where possible, it uses existing procedures and processes of MDBs to monitor results at the country or project level (i.e. minimize transaction costs and strengthen existing systems)

Assessment/Guiding Questions



- Apply to the development of the Strategic Program for Climate Resilience (Phase I of the PPCR) by participating countries
 - Designed as a guide for countries and development partners
- Will be used as an aid to the PPCR-SC for assessment purposes

Assessment/Guiding Areas



1. Climate Risk Assessment: a) key climate impacts, b) vulnerabilities in sectors, populations, ecosystems, c) implications of climate change
2. Institutions/coordination: a) arrangements in place, b) mechanisms for disaster management
3. Prioritization: a) process, b) national development priorities, policies, plans and climate risks taken into account, c) link of climate impact on other development priorities, d) rationale for choosing components of the SPCR
4. Gaps, needs and opportunities analysis
5. Stakeholder engagement/participation: a) involvement of stakeholders, vulnerable groups identified, strategy lead
6. Awareness-raising: information-sharing in countries engaged in PPCR
7. Monitoring and evaluation: a) extent of identification of key results, indicators and baselines in strategic approach, outline of monitoring system to measure and aggregate results from interventions at national level
