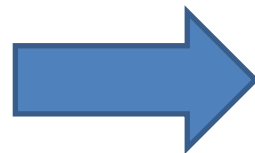

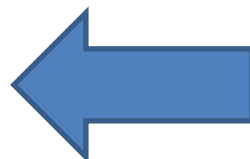

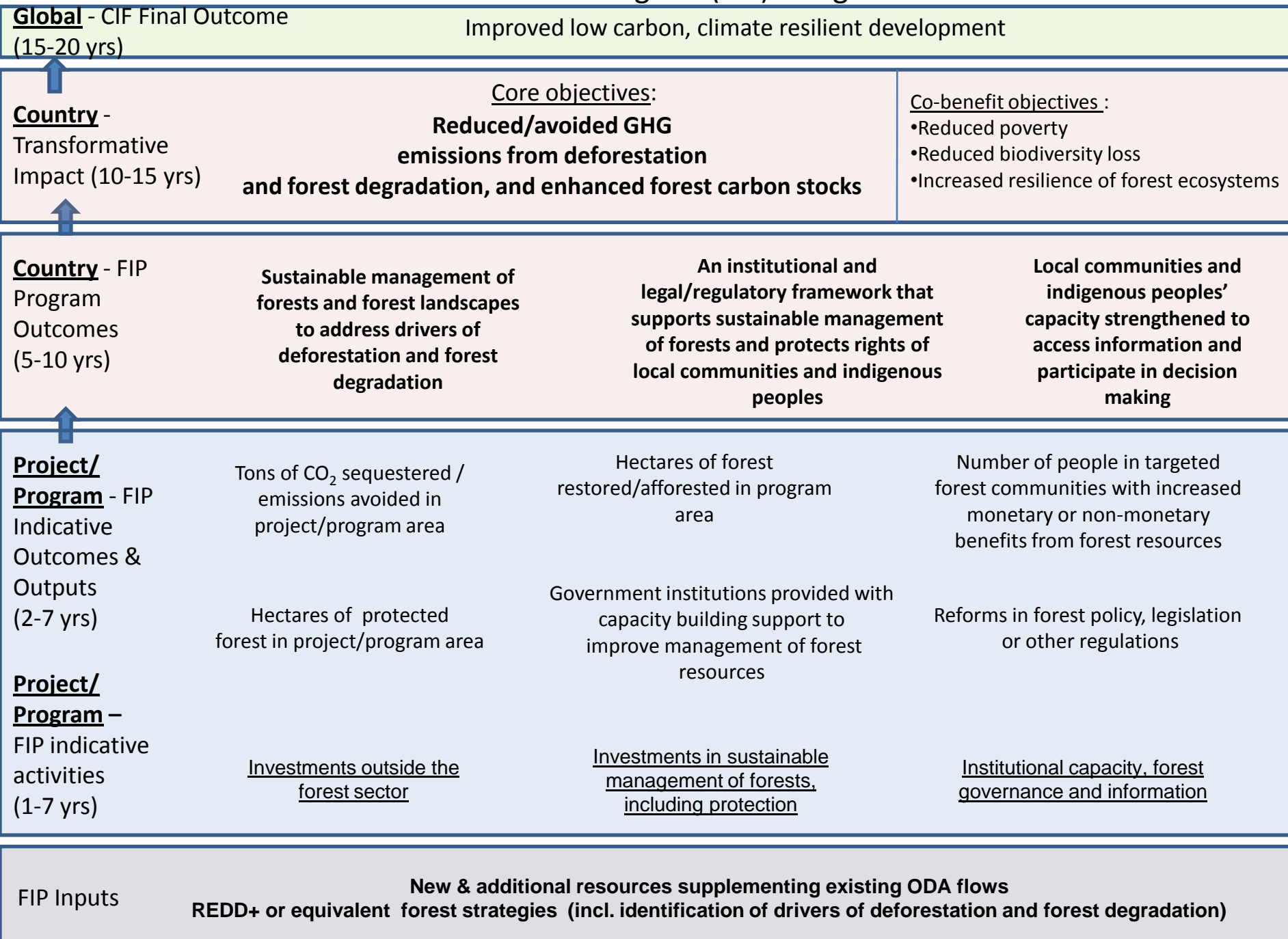

# Forest Investment Program (FIP) – Logic Model



**Global** - CIF Final Outcome (15-20 yrs) Improved low carbon, climate resilient development

**Country** - Transformative Impact (10-15 yrs)

**Core objective:** Reduced GHG emissions from deforestation and forest degradation; enhancement of forest carbon stocks

**Co-benefit objective:** Reduced poverty through improved quality of life of forest dependant indigenous peoples and forest communities

**Co-benefit objective:** Reduced biodiversity loss and increased resilience of forest ecosystems to climate variability and change

**Country** - FIP Catalytic Replication Outcomes (5-10 yrs)

**Reduced deforestation and forest degradation and enhanced conservation**

Increased direct management of forest resources by local communities and indigenous peoples

Improved enabling environment for REDD + and sustainable management of forests

Access to predictable and adequate financial resources, incl. results-based incentives for REDD+ and sustainable management of forests

**Regional level:** Replication of FIP learning in non-FIP countries

**Project/Program** - FIP Outputs & Outcomes (2-7 yrs)

**Reduced pressure on forest and its ecosystems**

Sustainable management of forests and forest landscapes to address drivers of deforestation and forest degradation

An institutional and legal/regulatory framework that supports sustainable management of forests and protects the rights of local communities and indigenous peoples

Empowered local communities and indigenous peoples and protection of their rights

**CIF Program**

New & additional resources for REDD+ implementation

Integration of learning by development actors active in REDD+

**Knowledge Management**

Learning about piloting & implementation captured & shared across projects and programs

**Project/Program** - FIP Activities (1-7 yrs)

Increased capacity to address direct and underlying drivers of deforestation and forest degradation (as identified in national REDD+ strategies or equivalents )

Investments outside the forest sector

Investments in sustainable management of forests, including protection

Institutional capacity, forest governance and information

Leveraging Increased other public & private sources of financing / investment

FIP Inputs

**New & additional resources supplementing existing ODA flows**

**REDD+ or equivalent forest strategies (incl. identification of drivers of deforestation and forest degradation)**

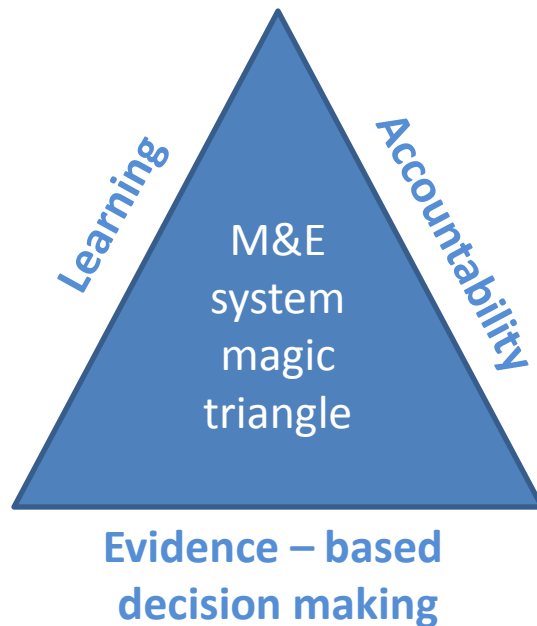
# Linking projects/programs with FIP objectives

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The revised results framework requires that projects/programs submitted for Sub-Committee approval ...

- ❖ ... clearly articulate how the outputs will contribute to a FIP outcome (results chain)
- ❖ ... include a DRAFT results frameworks at the program/project level with a set of concise output indicators

# M&E Reports



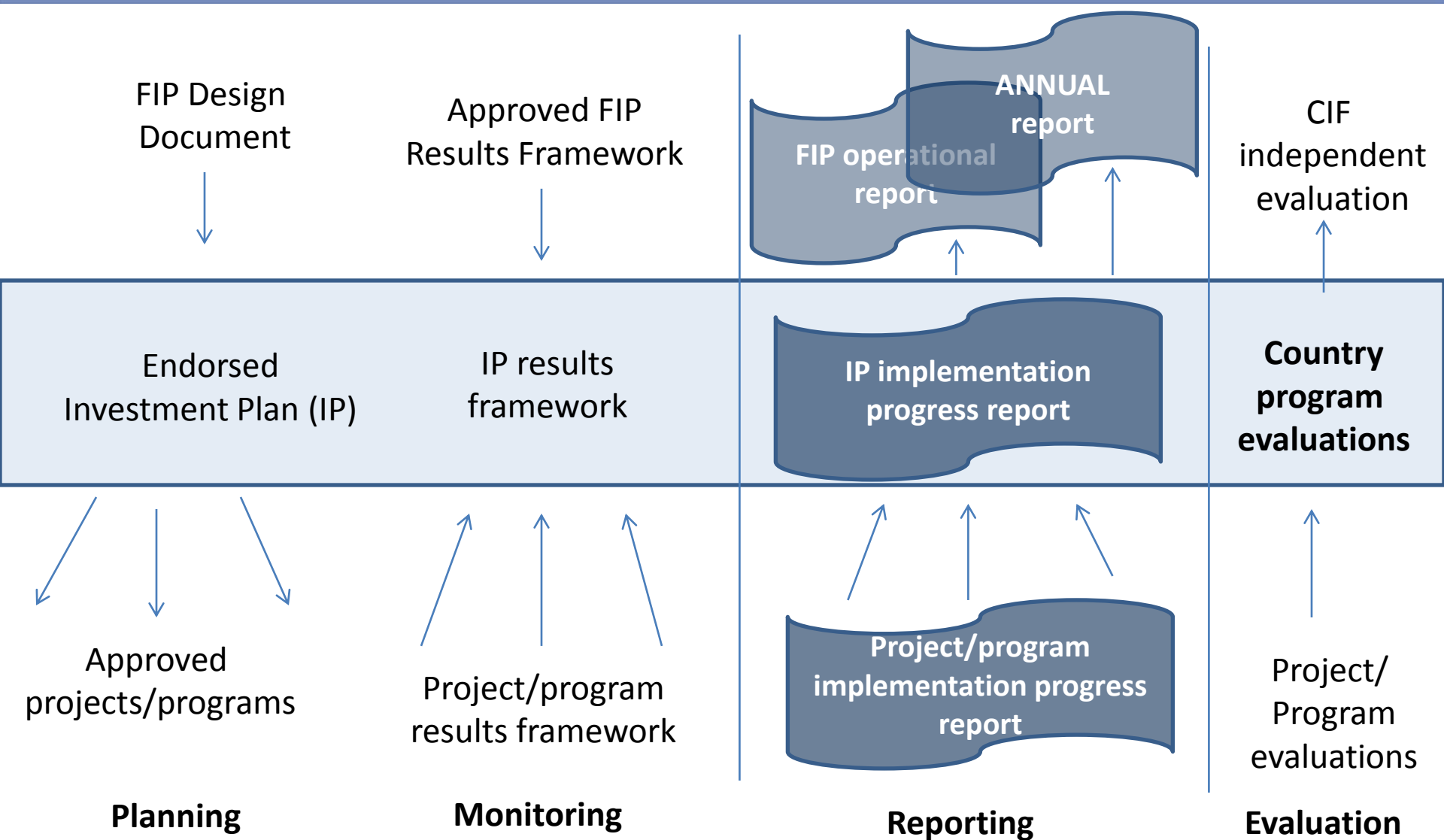
- An M&E report is an opportunity for implementers to inform themselves & others (stakeholders, partners, donors, etc.) on the progress, problems, difficulties encountered, success & lessons learned during implementation of programs and activities
- An M&E reports is a communication tool to present M&E results by presenting raw data & information as knowledge

Key message:

**FIP M&E is primarily a management tool for the country to make informed decisions concerning the transformational process – public accountability and learning**

# FIP results reporting framework

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# Implementing a programmatic approach

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**OBJECTIVE: Reporting progress in implementing the Investment Plan**

**Reduced/avoided GHG emissions from deforestation and forest degradation, and enhanced forest carbon stocks**

Country in the lead of reporting:

- **Dialogue** among development partners – broad based ownership
- **Consolidate/coordinate** project/program output information – sharing lessons

Key message:

**FIP pilot country is the central reporting unit to the FIP Sub-Committee**



Phase 1: **Establish baselines for FIP indicators**

Phase 2: **Portfolio development reporting**

Phase 3: **Results reporting**

Implementation status of the Investment Plan (outputs, outcomes, co-benefits)

Key accomplishments/lessons

Key issues / challenges

Plans for next reporting period

Key message:

**BASELINES AND TARGETS need to be established by April 2013**

# Implementing a programmatic approach - CONCLUSION

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**Strategic management of the transformation process** – FIP pilot countries need to develop their own theory of change

**Coherent M&E system** – FIP indicators need to be part of the national M&E system with clear assigned organizational roles and responsibilities

**Facilitation** – convening power to bring together various stakeholders on a regular basis (at least once a year) to discuss progress and share lessons

**Capacity** – human and technical capacity to consolidate data and prepare reports

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**FIP pilot country is the central reporting unit to the FIP Sub-Committee**

**FIP M&E is primarily a management tool for the country to make decisions concerning the transformational process – public accountability and learning**

**BASELINES AND TARGETS need to be established by April 2013**

**Don't forget the "E" in M&E – Countries need to take the lead in the evaluation process – this requires evaluation capacity at the national level**
