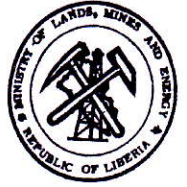

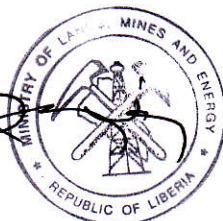
We are pleased to inform you that Liberia is still interested in participating in the SREP, and would like to begin work to develop an investment plan for scaling up the use of renewable energy.
