



## ***FOREST INVESTMENT PROGRAM (FIP) – Cameroon***

**SECOND JOINT MISSION  
May 15-26, 2017**

**===o TERMS OF REFERENCE o===**



## **1. Context of the Mission**

The Republic of Cameroon was in May 2016 selected as one of the pilot nations to benefit from a support to elaborate an Investment Plan (IP) for the Forest Investment Program (FIP). Thus, a subsidy of USD 250,000 was granted to the country to complete the elaboration of its Investment Plan with the support of the Multilateral Development Banks (MDBs) which in this case were: the African Development Bank and the World Bank, in cooperation with all stakeholders (bilateral partners, private sector, civil society and indigenous people) in order to provide the necessary technical assistance to the Cameroonian government.

It's within this framework that many missions were organized under the auspices of the Cameroon government and the World Bank as the lead of the MDBs. The most important things to mention here would be:

- The mission of managerial staff of the IP/FIP that held in Yaoundé (21-25 September 2015). Its aim was to initiate dialogue with the government and to plan together the activities of developing an Investment Plan. This mission led to the elaboration of an Action Plan, of which was the organization of two joint missions.
- Completion of the terms of reference (ToR) and the launching of an international invitation to tender and recruitment of a consortium in charge of elaborating the IP/FIP of Cameroon.
- The MDBs managerial staff mission (13-14 June 2016) which served to discuss with the government on the timing of the IP/FIP preparation and laid the foundation of the joint mission.
- The first joint mission (2-7 October 2016). The aim of this mission was to evaluate together with all stakeholders the progress made so far in the IP elaboration process as well as the investment priorities. The mission examined the project document submitted by the government and made remarks related to: (i) respect of the guidelines for the preparation of the IP/FIP (ii) capitalize on existing guidelines especially those related to deforestation and forest degradation. The mission examined a preliminary proposition of strategic options suggested by the government. The latter interests were based on sectorial (agriculture, livestock, forests and wood energy) and transversal (governance, landed and territorial development) options. The mission noted the relevance of these preliminary choices and recommended a deeper analysis for their justification. Also, it is considered that the key studies to furnish the national strategy such as: studies on the factors of

deforestation and forest degradation, analysis of environmental and social strategies and other strategic studies being launched as part of the REDD+ national process will be an excellent source of information for future steps of the FIP completion process.

On the other hand, it was recommended that gender issues, indigenous people and migration be integrated in a transversal manner. All comments and recommendations have been included in the ‘‘Checklist’’, which in a succinct manner specifies the future steps that will lead to the evaluation of the IP/FIP draft during the second joint mission.

The second joint mission which is subject to the terms of reference, constitutes a primordial step in the completion process of the IP/FIP of Cameroon and is thereby based on the results obtained from the comments and recommendations made during the first mission held from the 02-07 of October 2016.

The second joint mission will be coordinated by the FIP Focal Point for Cameroon in the Ministry of Environment, Nature Protection and Sustainable Development (MINEPDED), who will invite representatives from other sectorial ministries. They receive support from MDBs, especially: the group from the African Development Bank and that from the World Bank.

### **Objectives of the joint mission**

With support from the Cameroonian government, the MDBs will conduct a second FIP joint mission from the 15 -26 May 2017. This mission will have as objectives to:

- Assess the status of implementation of the October 2016 joint mission recommendations ;
- Discuss and pre validate the draft IP/FIP proposed by the government;
- Carry out further discussions with stakeholders, especially the private sector, sectorial ministries, the civil society and indigenous people;
- Ensure complementarity and synergy between the IP/FIP and axes of the REDD+ national strategy of Cameroon;
- Discuss and or re-enforce the fundraising strategy to fund projects/programs proposed by the IP/FIP especially those with the CAFI Initiative ;
- Work out an elaborate an action plan for the completion of the IP/FIP before their submission to the FIP Sub-Committee.

The second joint mission will hold in the form of technical meetings and workshops with the participation of all stakeholders. The final draft of the IP/FIP will be presented in a plenary session. The stakeholders (civil society, private sector, national institutions and indigenous people, technical and financial partners) will thus have the opportunity to comment and contribute substantially to the amelioration of the said document during group sessions.

## 2. Expected results

The following results are expected from the second joint mission:

- To confirm that the guidelines and recommendations of the first mission have been taken into consideration;
- The draft proposed by the government contains important points found in the REDD+ National Strategy;
- Strengthen consultations with stakeholders and ensure their involvement in the IP/FIP draft;
- Completion of a fundraising strategy for projects/programs selected under the IP/FIP ;
- A plan of action for the completion and submission of IP/FIP is validated and implemented.
