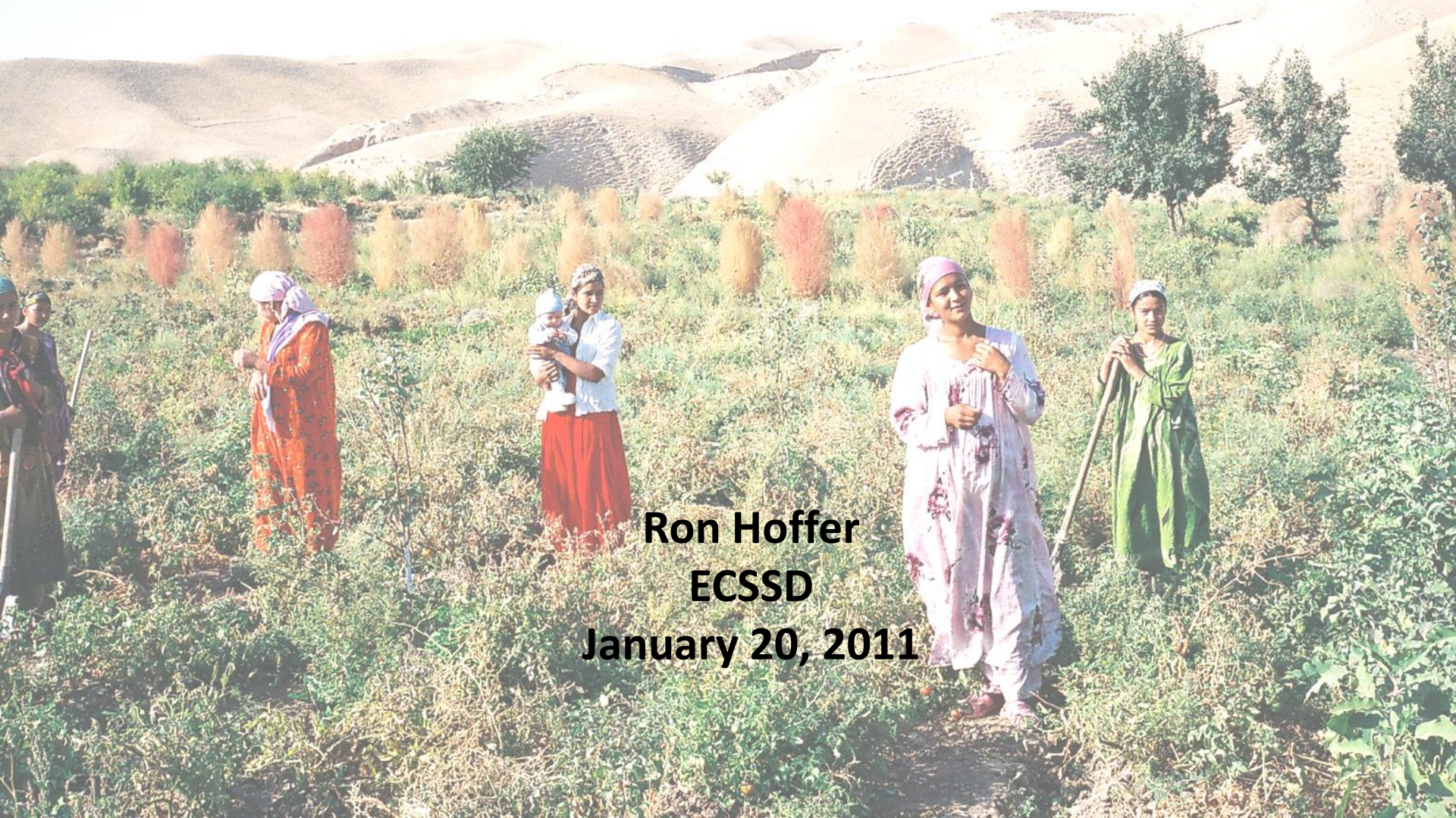


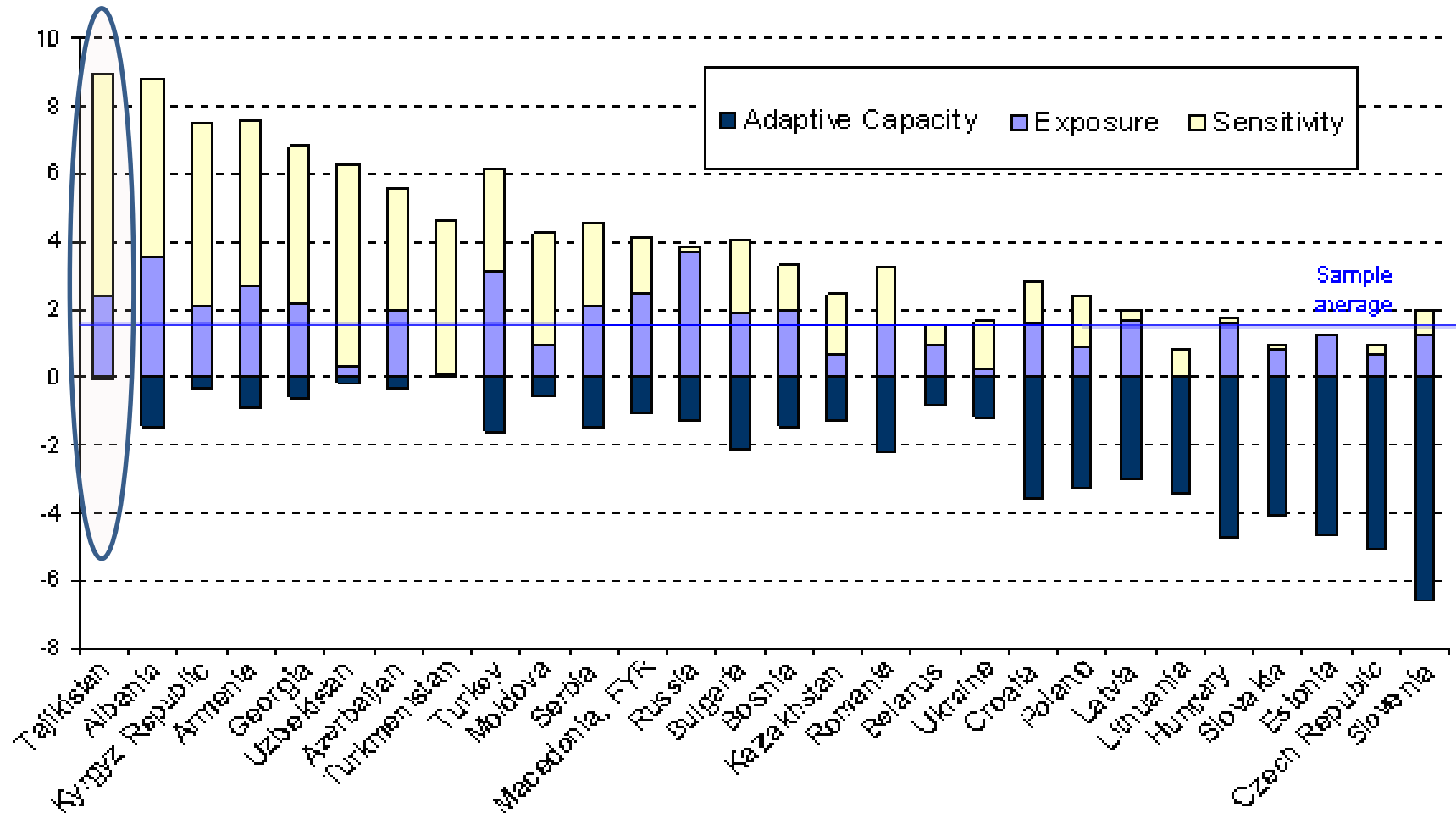

Fragile state - falling poverty rates - low FDI - governance challenges



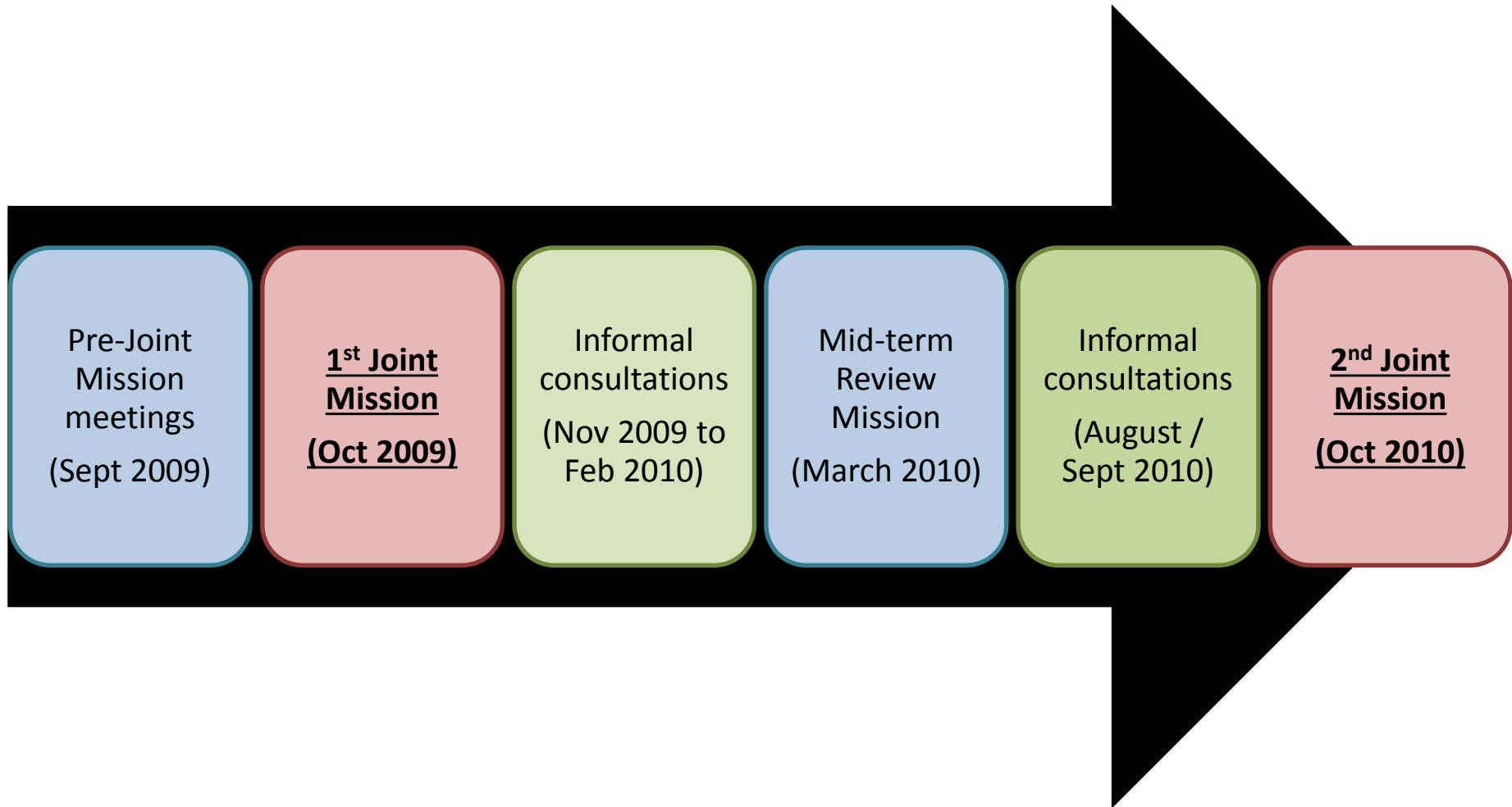

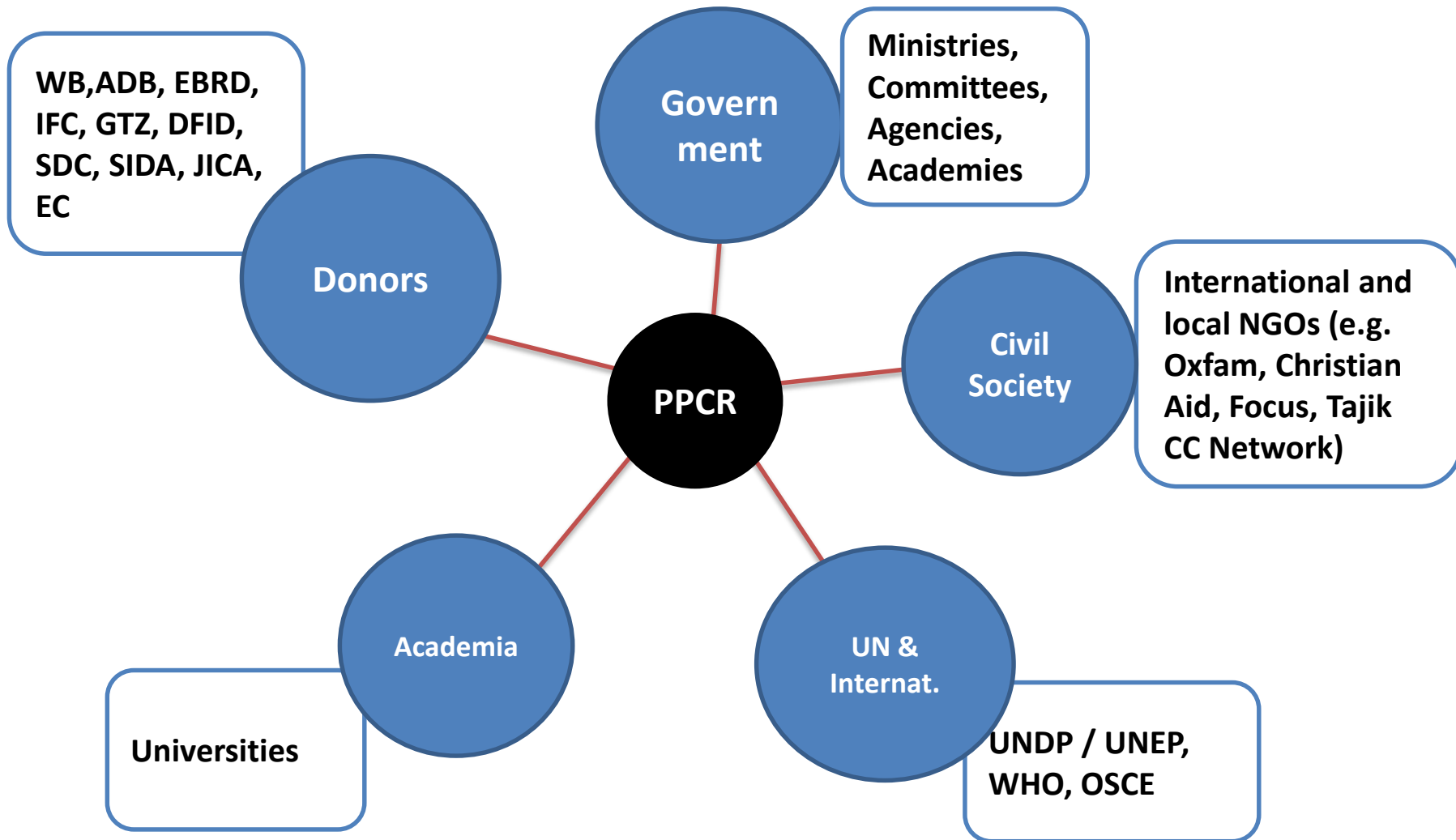
How was the SPCR Developed?



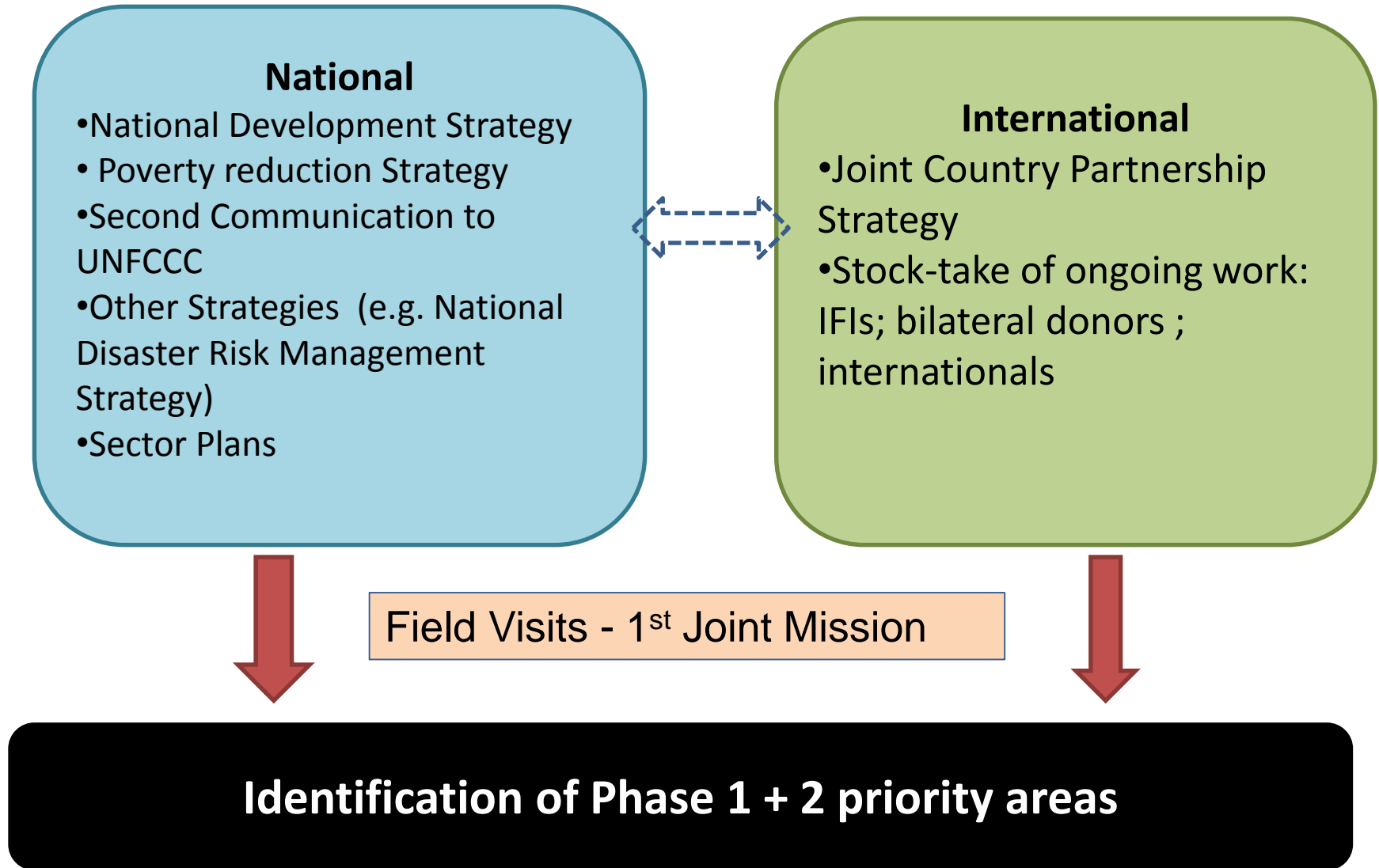
Continuous Consultation



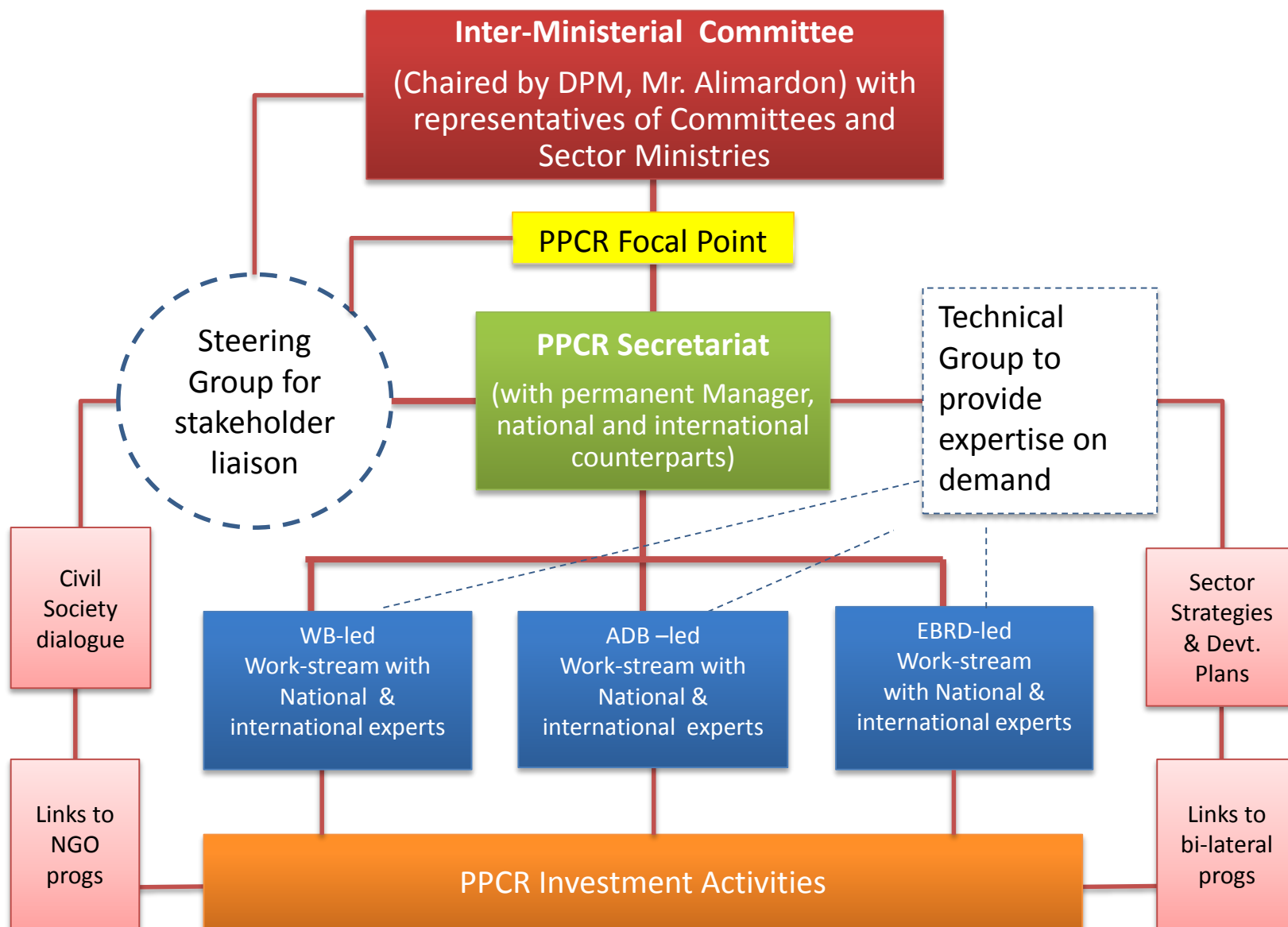
Comprehensive Consultation

Reflecting on the Experience
